Dear Members of the Pretoria Amateur Radio Club and Guests: Geagte Lede van die Pretoria Amateur Radio Klub en Gaste:

<u>Silent Keys</u>: We remember with sadness and pay tribute to PARC members Johan Classen ZS6IAM and Tony Crowder ZS6CRO who passed away this year. Johan was the father of Uys Classen ZS6UYS. Tony was well known for many years in the rally community, and was also the auditor of PARC.

<u>Club Membership</u>: PARC membership currently is 125 paid up members, which is an increase of 15% compared to the membership number the previous year. We sincerely thank our Members for their support and loyalty.

<u>Club Veterans</u>: Our annual veterans breakfast has proved to be a tremendous success every year. It is an event where Club Members older than 60 years old get the opportunity to meet, have a good time to converse about their wonderful times they had, and enjoy a meal. This year we had the opportunity to meet at "Jan se Skuld" on the 10th of October, as was attended by seventeen Club Members and seven guests. We sincerely thank these members for their hard work while having lots of fun, and encourage members to join them in making PARC again a competitive force with radio contests.

<u>Watts</u>: Having been the editor of Watts the past 4 years has been a tremendous pleasure, and I sincerely thank our Club Members for their treasured contributions. In particular Hans Kappetijn ZS6KR and Vincent Harrison ZS6BTY for their regular contributions, and in particular again Vincent for the electronic distribution of Watts. I have realised that Watts need not only contain radio related topics, and that articles on general science have been well received. My sincere thanks to all have contributed the past four years.

<u>RAE Training</u>: John Minter ZS6LED is sincerely thanked for his hard work and contributions with RAE training and getting prospective radio amateurs registered for the examination. Even during the lockdown period, John has achieved getting a group of prospective hams prepared for the examination, and all of them have passed. A most significant feat he has overcome. However, it did not dampen the Ham spirit. A significant increase in radio activity resulted in a revival in the use of radio communications. We sincerely hope and believe that a great number of good has come from this unfortunate global pandemic. With regards to the 90



years and beyond future of the Pretoria Amateur Radio Club, I propose a number of goals for the next Committee which include the following:

- 1) Due to restrictions encounterd this year, the opportunity to host a 90 year celebration function was not possible, and a re-planning of this event should be considered and conducted at a time when conditions are more favourable.
- 2) Although our Sunday morning bulletins are of a good standard, opportunities for improvement should be identified and implemented in order to provide an even better service to our local and international listeners. Contingency plans need to be formulated in the event where the inevitable may occur.
- 3) We are in the process of conducting inspections and evaluations of our current repeater sites, recording all the necessary details of equipment of all the sites. Consequently, using the new electronic registration procedure on the ICASA website, five year in advance licence renewals will be conducted using this platform.
- 4) An evaluation of our current website design and layout need to be conducted, and suggestions and participation from Club Members are invited and encouraged. A blog where active participation by club members on various matters should be considered.

If there are any other matters which warrant consideration for our future goals, please feel free to contact the new committee in the near future.
