

South African Radio League – 90 Years

The year 2015 celebrates the 90th anniversary of the South African Radio League. Following short on the SARL, Pretoria Amateur Radio Club celebrates it's 85th Jubilee. These milestones illustrate the rich histories of both Organizations and all the Radio Hams which made these achievements possible.

To celebrate this milestone for the SARL, which was formed in May 1925, a special callsign will be made available for clubs and individuals to use for limited periods during 2015. As the first radio contact in South Africa was made in Port Elizabeth by Edward Alfred Jennings, the first person to use the ZS90SARL call-sign will be Theunis Potgieter, ZS2EC, of PEARS.

Give ZS90SARL a call and celebrate 90 years of SARL and the first transmission from Port Elisabeth. ZS2EC will be operating ZS90SARL from 1 January till 11 January 2015. Clubs and amateurs wishing to use the call-sign from their station are invited to send their requests to <u>sarl90@sarl.org.za</u> with suggested dates and planned operation. 

SARL Membership


Following a discussion on the SARL forum, it was decided that Form B from now does not need to be completed in order to renew amateur radio licences. ICASA will send out renewal reminders in January 2015, and licence fees are due on 1 April.

Radio Amateurs can exercise their option to pay for 5 years in advance. Please send an email to <u>dkuhrau@icasa.org.za</u> and advise him that you are converting to a 5 year licence, which will amount to R500, saving R100. Please ensure that when paying your licence to inform ICASA of your licence number and callsign.

On the International scientific front, a number of major events will take place during 2015. Here are some to wet the appetite:



Physicists will be watching the Large Hadron Collider in Geneva in March when the particle smasher is set to return to action after a two-year closedown. Having turned it off and then turned it on again, scientists will be hoping the great device – which was used to discover the Higgs boson in 2013 – will be restored to even greater power. Its beams of protons were smashed into each other at joint energies of 8 trillion electron volts (Tev) when the device closed for its upgrade. After its reboot, it should be possible to create collisions of up to 13 Tev. At this level, it is expected the LHC – a 27km tunnel under the Jura mountains – will create a host of new particles that will help scientists at CERN unravel more of the mysteries of the structure of matter and the laws that govern the sub-atomic world.



NASA's New Horizons spacecraft is expected to fly by Pluto and it's largest satellite, Charon and explore the area for apprximately 5 months, until the distance gets too great. The spacecraft will then enter the Kuiper Belt and eventually leave the Solar System.

Launched on 19 January 2006, the New Horizons was given a Jupiter gravity assit on during February 2007. Having travelled for 3268 days up to now, the spacecraft is expected to reach Pluto during July 2015 which is within approximately 193 from now. Launched in September 2007, the Dawn space probe is intended to study two of the most massive objects in the asteroid belt – the protoplanet Vests and the dwarf planet Ceres. Dawn completed a fourteen month survey of Vesta during 2011-2012, and is currently en route to Ceres. It is expected to arrive in April 2015. The main objectives of the mission is to answer questions about the formation of the formation of the Solar System, and test the feasibility of it's lon Drive. Tim Peake, 42, will become Britain's first official astronaut when he flies on a Soyuz spacecraft to the international space station in November. Several British-born men and women have already flown into space, but as privately paid crew of commercial missions or through their US citizenship. By contrast, Peake – a former army helicopter pilot – is an official member of the European Space Agency's astronaut corps.

Peake began ESA's astronaut basic training course in September 2009 and graduated in November 2010. Peake, who was born in Chichester, West Sussex, will stay on the ISS on a six-month mission which has been named Principia after Isaac Newton's text on the laws of motion and gravity, *Principia Mathematica*.




The International Year of Light and Light-based Technologies, 2015 (IYL 2015) will take place from 19-20 January 2015 in Paris, France. This United Nations observance aims to raise awareness of the achievements of light science and it's applications, and it's importance to humankind. Awareness will be raised on how optical technologies promote sustainable development and provide solutions to global challenges in energy, education, agriculture, communications and health.

The International Year of Soils, 2015 (IYS 2015) was declared by the 68th session of the UN General Assembly. In addition to increasing the awareness and understanding of the importance of soil for food security and essential ecosystem functions, the IYS wish to raise full awareness of the profound importance of soil for human life. The IYS wish to educate public of the role of soil in climate change, poverty alleviation and sustainable development.





One of the big questions technology companies, including Apple, Samsung and Google, are asking is: why would anyone buy a smartwatch? All see fitness as one of the most convincing answers so far. The smartwatch – wrist-worn devices capable of running apps and connecting to the internet, usually via a paired smartphone – is a young category, but health has already emerged as one of its key selling points. Samsung's **Gear 2 and Gear Fit** devices are good examples, capable of measuring their wearer's steps and heart rate, and transmitting that data to a smartphone to provide feedback. Rival models from Sony, LG and Motorola have similar health features. Soon, they will be joined by the **Apple Watch**, which will track general activity as well as harder workouts, feeding everything back to a health app on the owner's iPhone. All these companies hope that the appeal of better fitness tracking will encourage people to buy this early generation of smartwatches, with their drawbacks – battery life rarely longer than a day, for example.
