AMSAT SA Space Symposium: Report by Louis de Wet ZS6SK

The AMSAT SA Space Symposium was held on the 16th of March 2019, at the Premier Hotel, Midrand. Hans van de Groenendaal ZS6AKV, President of AMSAT SA opened the event, while Linden Petzer, Chief Director: Radio & Satellite Communications DTPS, delivered the keynote address, with a presentation entitled "*Current activities in the ITU with respect to small satellites*".



Linden Petzer discussed the birth of small satellites and how they are applied in the amateursatellite service, and how these satellites are utilized in a wide variety of missions and applications such as remote sensing, space weather research, astronomy, communications, technology demonstrations, education and commercial applications. Subsequently, although they may operate under various radio-communication services, they are nevertheless registered as "amateur satellites". The International Telecommunications Union (ITU) has issued two reports relating two small satellites, which are obtainable from their website:

Report SA2312: *Characteristics, definitions and spectrum requirements of nano-satellites and pico-satellites, as well as systems composed of such satellites.*

Report SA 2348: *Current practice and procedures for notifying space networks currently applicable to nano-satellites and pico-satellites.*

Another publication entitled *"Handbook on Amateur and Amateur-Satellite Services"*, Available at: <u>https://www.itu.int/pub/R-HDB-52-2014</u> is another valuable source of information.

Mr Petzer concluded his presentation by stating that a simplified regulatory regime for the coordination, notification and recording procedures for frequency assignments pertaining to non-GSO satellites with short duration missions is required. Work is currently underway within the ITU-R Study Groups on the TT&C spectrum requirements for non-GSO satellites with short duration missions.

Anton Janovsky ZR6AIC presented a talk entitled "Artificial Intelligence to identify satellite signals". During a moment where computer hardware baffled us older men, the young and very helpful Glen Bailey ZR6G came to our rescue a number of times

Tom van der Bon ZR6TG presented two papers entitled: "The SatNOGS opensource ground station and network", and "Build an educational CubeSat that can be used for experimentation and teaching in the classroom". For the first presentation his abstract was as follows: The SatNOGS system is completely opensource and allows you to develop and build on it. All satellite ground station owners also have access to other stations around the world. Using an antenna, SDR and Raspberry Pi you can build your own DIY Satellite Ground Station that can be used to track and decode various telemetry/data from different satellites that pass over South Africa. For the second presentation his abstract was as follows: "CubeSats are becoming very popular as a great space research tool. Unfortunately, education on CubeSats only starts at a university level. We need a tool to promote and teach about CubeSats and create a new generation of space researchers (and enthusiasts of all ages) excited about launching their own CubeSats. Hannes Coetzee ZS6BZP presented a talk on Es'hailSat -Amateur Radios first geostationary satellite, and also presented a practical demonstration on how to utilize the satellite. The satellite carries an AMSAT linear transponder as a secondary payload, named Quatar Oscar 100 (QO100), giving over 1.5 million amateurs access for the first time to a geostationary satellite.



SA space frame, which was a progress from the first- Glen Bailey ZR6G. generation frame designed and developed by Deon Coetzee ZR1DX. This 3rd generation design includes solar panels and antenna development.



Frik Wolf ZS6FZ elaborated on the third generation AMSAT Father and Son Ham Radio team Shane Bailey ZS6W and



Husband and Wife Ham Radio Team Brian Jacobs ZS7YZ and Anette Jacobs ZR6D. Both Brian and Anette are often heard on the SARL Bulletins and Amateur Radio Today, where Anette conducts the Afrikaans versions of the Bulletin, and Brian conducts VHF and UHF tutorials. Brian presented a talk entitled "*Developing a reverse beacon network*", which has evolved to become a powerful tool with many Amateur Radio applications, mostly on the HF bands. According to Brian, the RBN concept also provides unique opportunities for real time propagation awareness on VHF and UHF. During his presentation, Brian demonstrated the concept with some practical examples.



Hans van de Groenendaal ZS6AKV and Leon Lessing ZS6LMG presented talks entitled "*Operate Satellite with the AMSAT SA Dual band Yagi*" and "*The versatility of WSPR in Amateur Radio and application for balloon flights*" respectively. Leon's presentation emphasized the fact that because payloads are so sophisticated on BACAR projects, retrieval of the payload is becoming all the more important.






Theo Bresler ZS6TVB does it again!

In the November 2018 issue of Watts, we published the results of Theo Bresler ZS6TVB for the CQWPX contest, which is probably the second largest annual Radio Amateur contest. Watts reported on the "Long John" antenna he was constructing in preparation for this contest on 27 – 28 October 2018, where approximately 35 000+ contenders compete. It was a 48-hour contest and he fully utilized his Long John antenna for many hours of hard work. Theo recently received the results of this contest, and he achieved 5th place worldwide in his category, Single Operator, 15m, High Power. During his previous effort in 2016 (he did not compete in 2017) he achieved 16th place worldwide, which is still excellent. In the 2018 contest, Theo achieved No 2 in Africa and No 1 in South Africa with a total score of 512 848. Looking at the certificate below in red: "South Africa and Zone 38. World Amateur Radio Day: 18 April 2019


On the 18th of April 1925 the International Amateur Radio Union was formed in Paris, hence the annual celebration of this event worldwide.

Amateur Radio experimenters were the first to discover that the short-wave spectrum — far from being a wasteland — could support worldwide propagation. In the rush to use these shorter wavelengths, Amateur Radio was "in grave danger of being pushed aside," the IARU's history has noted. Amateur Radio pioneers met in Paris in 1925 and created the IARU to support Amateur Radio worldwide.

Just two years later, at the International Radiotelegraph Conference, Amateur Radio gained the allocations still recognized today — 160, 80, 40, 20, and 10 meters. Since its founding, the IARU has worked tirelessly to defend and expand the frequency allocations for Amateur Radio. Thanks to the support of enlightened administrations in every part of the globe, radio amateurs are now able to experiment and communicate in frequency bands strategically located throughout the radio spectrum. From the 25 countries that formed the IARU in 1925, the IARU has grown to include 160 member-societies in three regions. IARU Region 1 includes Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Northern Asia. Region 2 covers the Americas, and Region 3 is comprised of Australia, New Zealand, the Pacific island nations, and most of Asia. The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) has recognized the IARU as representing the interests of Amateur Radio.

Today, Amateur Radio is more popular than ever, with more than 3,000,000 licensed operators!

World Amateur Radio Day is the day when IARU Member-Societies can show our capabilities to the public and enjoy global friendship with other Amateurs worldwide. *The text of this article was copied from*: <u>http://www.iaru.org/world-amateur-radio-day.html</u>






PARC History

Long Term HF Propagation for April 2019: Courtesy Vincent Harrison ZS6BTY

The graph below shows the predicted F-layer Maximum Usable Frequency (MUF) for propagation from Pretoria^[1] using monthly sunspot numbers from SILSO^[2].

<u>Local Propagation (up to 500 km</u>): The F or F2 critical frequency (f_oF2) is the MUF for short range, near vertical incidence sky-wave (NVIS) propagation.


Long Distance Propagation: The MUF for a first hop of 4000 km in the cardinal directions is labeled North, East, South and West. They indicate the direction that propagation may be expected.
